Woman's Missionary Union (WMU) is an auxiliary of the Southern Baptist Convention that seeks to teach and equip adults, youth, children, and preschoolers with Mission education to become radically involved in the mission of God. WMU is the largest Protestant missions' organization for women in the world. WMU offers many missions resources; teaching plans, volunteer opportunities, conferences, training for leaders and workers, ministry ideas and models, books, and much more. WMU quest is to minister to a dying world through acts of service and through expressions of God's love.

WHY MISSIONS? Mission shows you different ways to share the word of God. Every Christian has a part in the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20) and every Christian can train for a life of mission service. It helps missions become a way of life for everyone. Mission's education for all age levels helps make "MISSIONS FOR LIFE" real.

GOLDEN CIRCLE is a mission's organization for men and women who are Seniors 50 and older. Our mission is to visit church members and nonmembers who are hospitalized, homebound and/or in convalescent homes. We do visitation on Wednesdays of each month.
